Tests

- A test is given at the end of each "chapter". These tests are given about every 2 or 3 weeks, depending on the chapter.
- o If you miss a test, be prepared to take it within a week of your return. You cannot take a make-up test during class. We are constantly learning something new; therefore students need to be in class at all times. We will schedule make-up tests either before school, after school, or at a time convenient for both Ms. Cuilik and the student. It is NOT easy to find time to make up test....so PLEASE try to be in class at all times!

Quizzes

o I will be giving at least one short quiz a week. They will usually NOT be announced. Students will be able to use their notes on quizzes. The purpose of a quiz is to test for understanding of topics prior to testing. If a quiz is missed, it may be made up on the day of the student's return.

Homework

Homework will be assigned daily, and due the next day. Most of the time it will be graded for completion, but occasionally it will be taken up for accuracy. Completion will be graded out of 4 pts, as follows:

Are all problems done?

• Missing a few problems? 3/4

Halfway complete? 2/4

- o An additional point will be subtracted if assignment is late or not all of the work was shown.
 - Halfway complete, AND no work was shown? 1/4
- o I do allow students to fix up/re-do any assignment with a score of 2/4 or lower. However, they cannot earn a perfect score, because the revisions are late compared to a perfect assignment.

FOC

 There will be an EOC (End of Course) exam at the end of the year. This score will be worth 30% of your semester grade as mandated by the state. We will learn tips and tricks, do extensive practice, and take tests/quizzes to prepare you for this exam.
